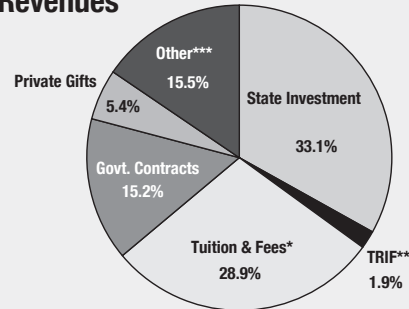

### Revenues

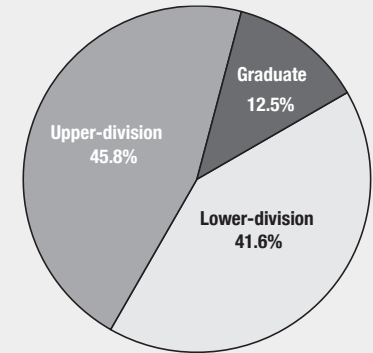
