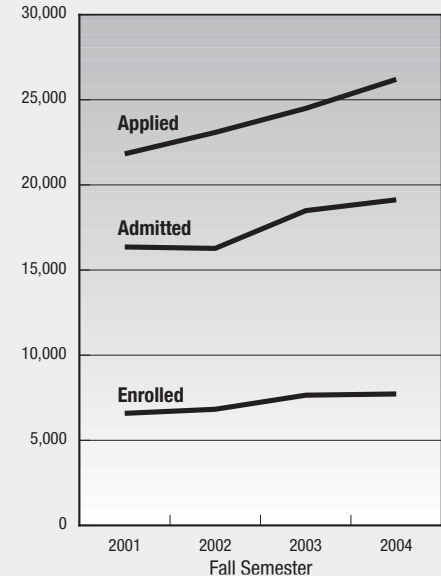

Freshman Three-year Trend



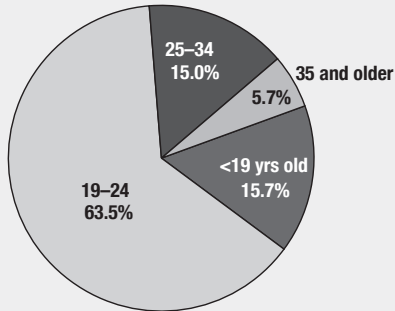

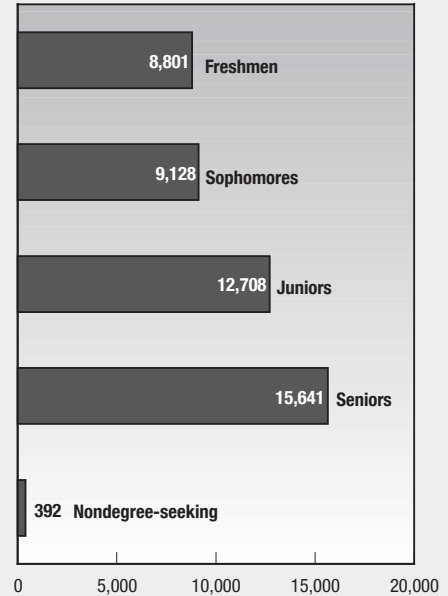

Enrollment by Level



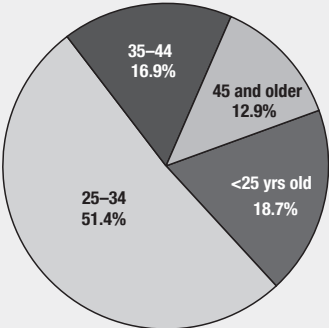

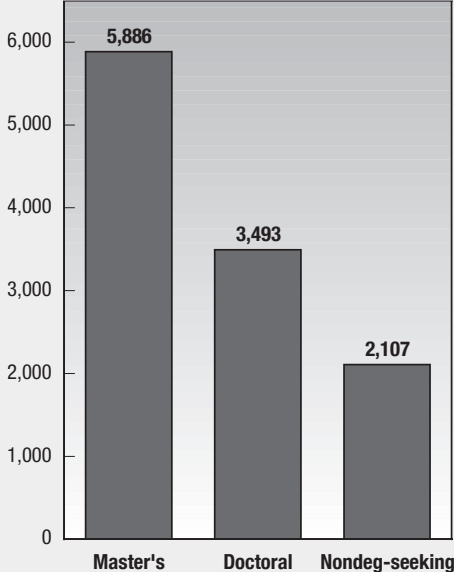

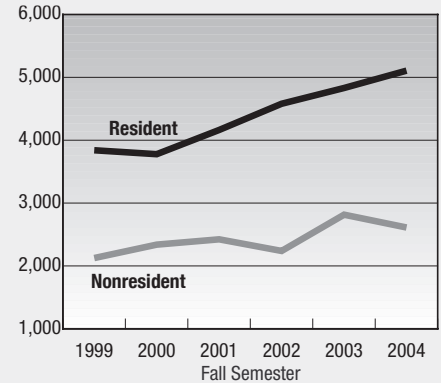

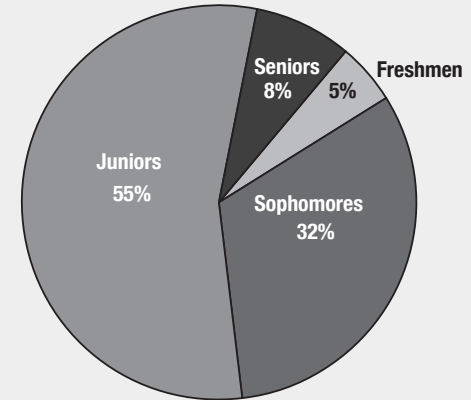

Fall 2004 Distribution by Level

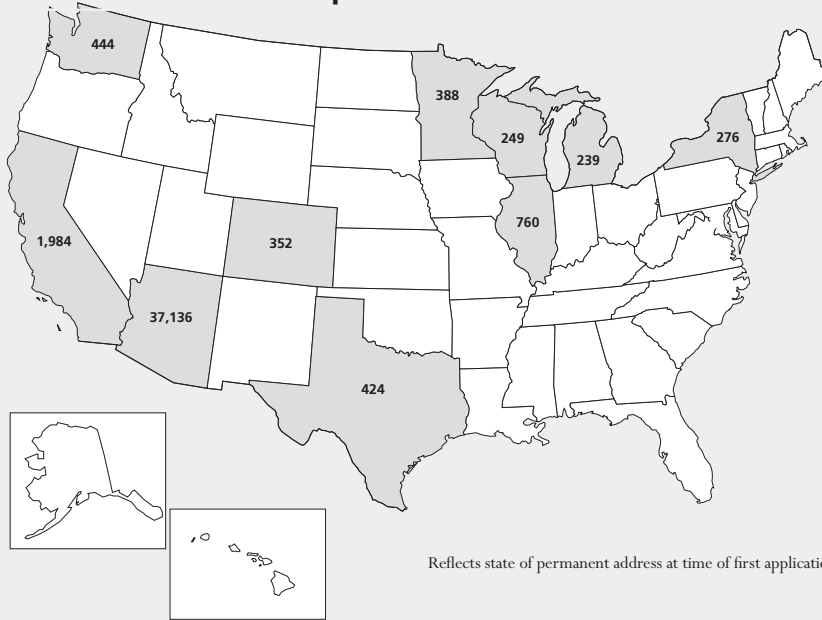

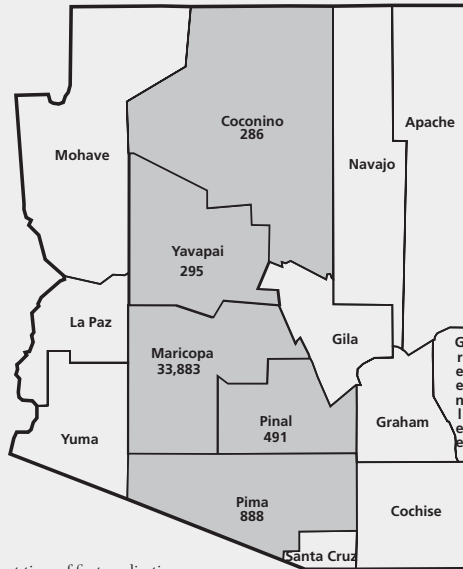

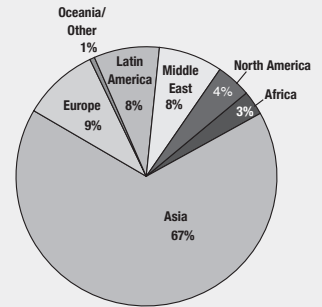

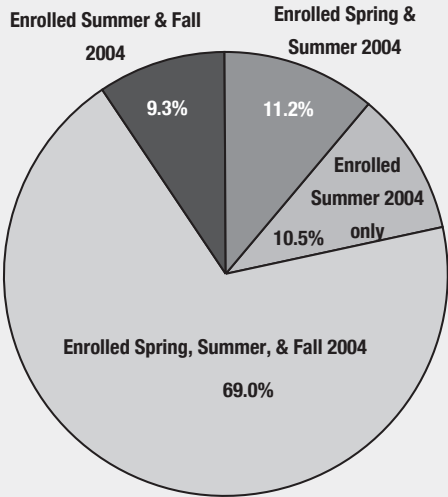

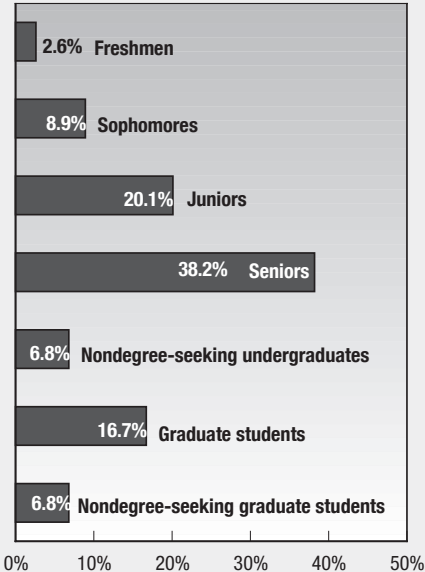

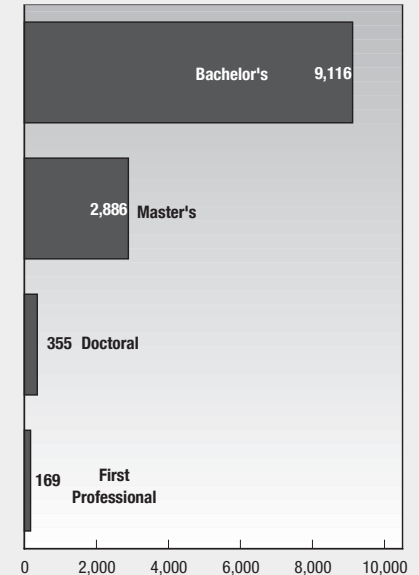

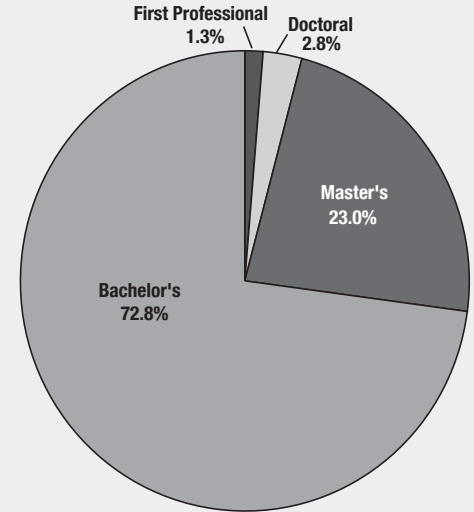

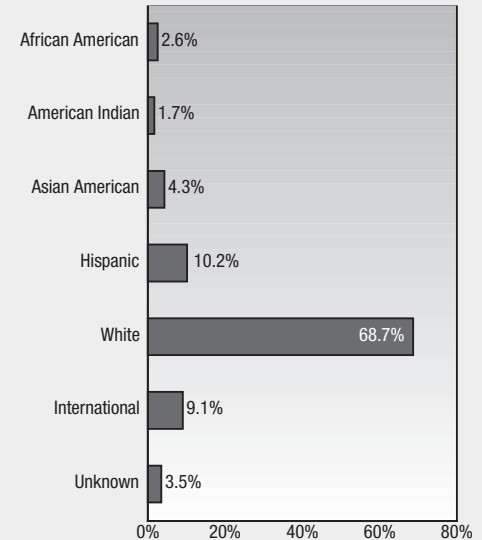
